The appointed **EYC 2024 Team Manager** shall assume complete control over the team(s) selected by the **Junior Selection Committee**. If not a Selector, the Team Manager shall act, in an advisory capacity, to the Selection Committee at team selection.

Prior to the Event the Team Manager's duties include:

- (1) Liaise with Coaches regarding Practice Sessions
- (2) Organise all Travel and Accommodation
- (3) Inform all team members of all event dates, travel, and accommodation arrangements.
- (4) Inform all team members of costs and collect, record and lodge any monies received into the Junior Subcommittees bank account.
- (5) Ensure all Bowler & Parent consent forms are completed.

At the Event the Team Manager's duties include:

- (1) Attend Managers' meeting accompanied by Coach(es)
- (2) Inform all bowlers of squad times and lane assignments.
- (3) Ensure all bowlers always act in a sporting manner.
- (4) Submit Team Manager's Report to the Executive within 7 days.
- (5) Ensure all Team Members, Coaches and Chaperones fully comply with ITBA Code of Ethics
